For the third year, Hunt Military Communities teamed up with wear blue: run to remember in organizing individual Memorial Day events in our communities. More than half of HMC locations participated in the worldwide event. wear blue: run to remember, a national, nonprofit organization is committed to building a running community that honors the service and sacrifice of the American military. It's

expected that over 20,000 runners and walkers around the world became part of a living memorial to America's fallen heroes and a show of support for the families they left behind.

Wear blue teams met at various locations worldwide to participate in this run including many HMC locations. The wear blue Memorial Day event uses the power of community and the accessibility of running and walking for community members to become a living memorial through their steps to honor generations of America's fallen heroes. Wear blue: run to remember was started by a Gold Star spouse, who lost her husband in Afghanistan, at the time she had a three year old, a one year old and a three week old.

Participants were provided with the name of an American Service Member who died in battle as well as a unique bib to share the name of the service member whom they honor with their steps. Each run began with a Circle of Remembrance where the name of each military member killed in war is called out.

Thank you to all who ran, walked, and supported this worthwhile event. It is because of your dedication to the cause we are able to honor and recognize our American fallen heroes in such a thoughtful way.

New Construction Update

Beginning June 17th, Hunt Military Communities will begin demolishing the Nani Ulupa'u homes so 40 four bedroom Field Grade Officer homes can be built. OMC wants to remind our residents about the importance of safety when dealing with demolition and construction. Here are a few items that we feel are very important when you and your family are around the construction zone:

- DO NOT enter the fenced in construction area
 - The construction fence to enclose the Nani Ulupa'u neighborhood began the week of May 28th
 - The fence will begin along the border of Mololani and run along Daly Road and Pond Road enclosing this area
 - Fence will close off Daly Road on June 12th and no traffic will be permitted thereafter
- There will be many construction trucks and heavy equipment entering and leaving the construction zone between 7:00 am to 5:30 pm, Monday through Friday with possible work on Saturday and Sunday
- PLEASE exercise caution at all times
- Drive NO faster than 15 mph when driving along the fenced constriction area
- Anticipate hearing equipment behind the construction fence
- Demolition anticipated to start on June 17th
 - Heavy equipment is utilized to demolish the buildings and concrete slabs
 - Anticipate loud noises during this activity
- DO NOT walk on the road. It is unsafe for people of all ages

We want to thank you for your cooperation in keeping our neighborhoods and families safe while construction is taking place at MCB Hawaii.

Move Out Tips

Here are some helpful tips you need to know to make your move less stressful and help you and your family pass the move out inspection!

- Trash cans and recycle bins must be emptied, cleaned, and placed in the garage
- All bulk trash must be disposed of prior to your final inspection
- Check the website for bulk trash pickup at www.ohanamarinecorpscommunities.com
- Appliances must be free of any grime and don't forget the sides
- All blinds, verticals, and ceiling fans must be free of dust
- Remove all nails, picture holders, molly bolts, anchor bolts, and any other hardware
- Remove all scuff marks, wallpaper, borders, and decals and restore the walls to their original condition
- Repair front and backyard damage and remove all animal waste

Preventative Maintenance: Caring for Your Refrigerator

Refrigerators operate 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, making them the most hard working appliance in our homes. To guarantee your fridge works at full capacity for as long as possible, consider adding a bit of refrigerator maintenance to your cleaning routine.

Daily Upkeep:

- Keep all food items covered to prevent odors
- Wipe up all spills immediately
- Make sure fridge is tightly closed by checking the door seals. Loose door seals waste energy and cause the fridge to work harder than necessary

Weekly Routine:

- Throw out old/unused food items
- Keep baking powder in the fridge and change out regularly
- Check the temperature. The fridge should remain between 37 and 40 degrees Fahrenheit

Monthly Tasks:

- Check and clean the coils regularly by keeping them free of dust and debris
- Empty the ice in the freezer often. Ice at the bottom of the dispenser tends to sit for long periods of time
- Check to ensure your fridge is level. Refrigerators that rock side to side won't close properly
- A properly maintained fridge will make for a happier home! If you have any concerns about your fridge please reach out to dispatch to start a maintenance request
